STAN MALECKI

January Guest Speaker 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m.

On January 11, 2016, Stan Malecki will be our guest speaker at 2:00 p.m. Then, on the same day, at 5:00 p.m. he will be cooking an old recipe called "Hoppin John" for everyone to taste. Here is a little insight about our Guest Speaker. Stan loves re-enactments of historical figures. He is known to dress in period clothing and act as Master Koresh (Cyrus Teed). As well as Tobias MacIvey, a fictional character from the book "A Land Remembered". And, his newest character is Antonio Fernandez, a local resident who arrived here in 1899 and lived on Mound Key. Stan dresses as the Portuguese Immigrant and makes *Soupa-Soupa* and as he greets his guests, a group of kayakers who come to experience the delicious cabbage soup and a tour of Mound Key. Stan fills them with all kinds of stories about the Fernandez family and their hardships they endured.

You can find Stan at the Koreshan State Park at the outdoor Kitchen/Bakery on Thursday and Sunday's at 11:00 a.m. making whatever goodie is on the menu using an old restored stove from the mid-1800's. The special treat is Stan tells you stories of the locals as well as the Koreshans while he cooks. More recipes can be found at StanTheMan.wordpress.com.

Hoppin' John

- 6 oz. thick sliced peppered bacon, cut into 1/4 inch pieces.
- I medium onion chopped into ½ inch cubes
- I medium green pepper chopped into ½ inch cubes
- Salt to taste bacon may have enough salt
- I can of seasoned, southern style black eyed peas with liquid
- 2 Cups of cooked rice
- Water or broth

Fry bacon in pan and remove. Saute onion and green pepper in 2T. of bacon drippings. Add 1-2 cups of water (or beef broth) and beans with the liquid. If needed, salt to taste. Bring to a low boil and reduce heat and simmer uncovered for 15 minutes or until vegetables are cooked. Add more broth, if needed. Serve over cooked rice, or incorporate rice into Hoppin' John. Serves 3-4.
