Estero's New Sports Entertainment Facility Set to Transform Williams Rd Area

Excitement is building in the Estero community as plans for a new sports entertainment facility take shape. The location for this ambitious project has been identified as the stretch of Williams Rd between Via Coconut Road and the Golf Coast Driving Range, an area known for its potential to enhance the recreational options for local residents.



The overall vision for the project is to create a state-of-the-art facility that caters primarily to Estero residents, offering a wide range of sports and entertainment activities. With the community's interests in mind, village leaders have prioritized the development of this land to benefit the people who call Estero home.

However, not everyone shares the same perspective. Some residents express concerns that the growing community should focus on preserving green spaces rather than accommodating more development. They advocate for a balance between progress and preserving the natural beauty that has made Estero such an attractive place to live.

Despite the differing opinions, village leaders have given their approval for the preliminary site plans of the Williams Rd project. The first phase of this ambitious undertaking will be the construction of indoor pickleball courts, an increasingly popular sport in the area. The initial plan includes a minimum of 6 courts, with hopes to expand to up to 12 courts to accommodate the growing demand.



The project has generated mixed feelings among residents. While some are enthusiastic about the prospect of an entertainment district that brings diverse recreational options to Estero, they also stress the importance of preserving as much greenspace as possible. Comparatively, others view the sports entertainment facility as a preferable alternative to other proposed developments like apartments or condos.

With village leaders greenlighting the project, the focus now shifts to engaging builders and designers to create detailed site plans and bring the vision to life. The collaboration with experienced professionals in the field will ensure the development meets the community's expectations and aligns with Estero's unique character.

As the project progresses, the Estero community eagerly anticipates the unveiling of the sports entertainment facility. It promises to provide a hub for sports enthusiasts, families, and residents of all ages, offering a diverse range of activities and fostering a vibrant sense of community.

The upcoming months will undoubtedly be filled with further discussions, public input, and meticulous planning to strike a balance between progress and preserving Estero's natural charm. The new sports entertainment facility on Williams Rd aims to become a testament to Estero's commitment to meeting the needs of its residents while cherishing the beauty that surrounds them.



Household chemical waste collection scheduled at Estero Park on July 19, 2023



Residents will be able to dispose of household chemical waste safely and responsibly from 9 a.m. – 1 p.m. on Wednesday, July 19. Items will not be accepted either before or after that time period.

Chemical waste categories include items that are ignitable, corrosive, explosive and/or reactive and toxic. Never dispose of these items in dumpsters, compactors or at curbside with household garbage or down a storm drain or in the soil.

Coconut Pointe Residences at Brooks Town Center among topics for the Planning, Zoning & Design Board on July 11, 2023

The Board will start their meeting at 4:30 p.m., Tuesday, with a public information meeting for a development order for Coconut

Pointe Residences at Brooks Town Center. This is the proposed project to demolish the Winn Dixie building on the 9.95-acre parcel at the northwest corner of Coconut Road and Three Oaks Parkway.

A public hearing will then be conducted for the final plan to develop the 154-unit multifamily development of Coconut Pointe Residences at Brooks Town Center.

The Board will also conduct public hearings for the Estero Bay Chevrolet lighting upgrade and a development order for Via Coconut's mixed-use development with 330 multifamily units and commercial buildings located at 21650-21750 Via Coconut Point.

Meetings are held in the Council Chambers, Village Hall, 9401 Corkscrew Palms Circle, near the entrance to the Estero Community Park.

In case of an emergency, always call 911.


Everyone should have an emergency supply kit for your family and pets, with enough supplies to last at least 3 days without power.

Know Your Zone

Do you know your Evacuation Zone? Hurricane evacuation zones are no longer referenced by storm category, but are now named by hurricane surge evacuation zones: A, B, C, D and E. We want you to know your zone, and to challenge your friends and family to know the same!

Why is it important to know your zone in Lee County? We are evacuated by zones for storm surge and wind, in a phased manner. This means we may order the evacuation of zone A before you see any effects of the tropical storm.


